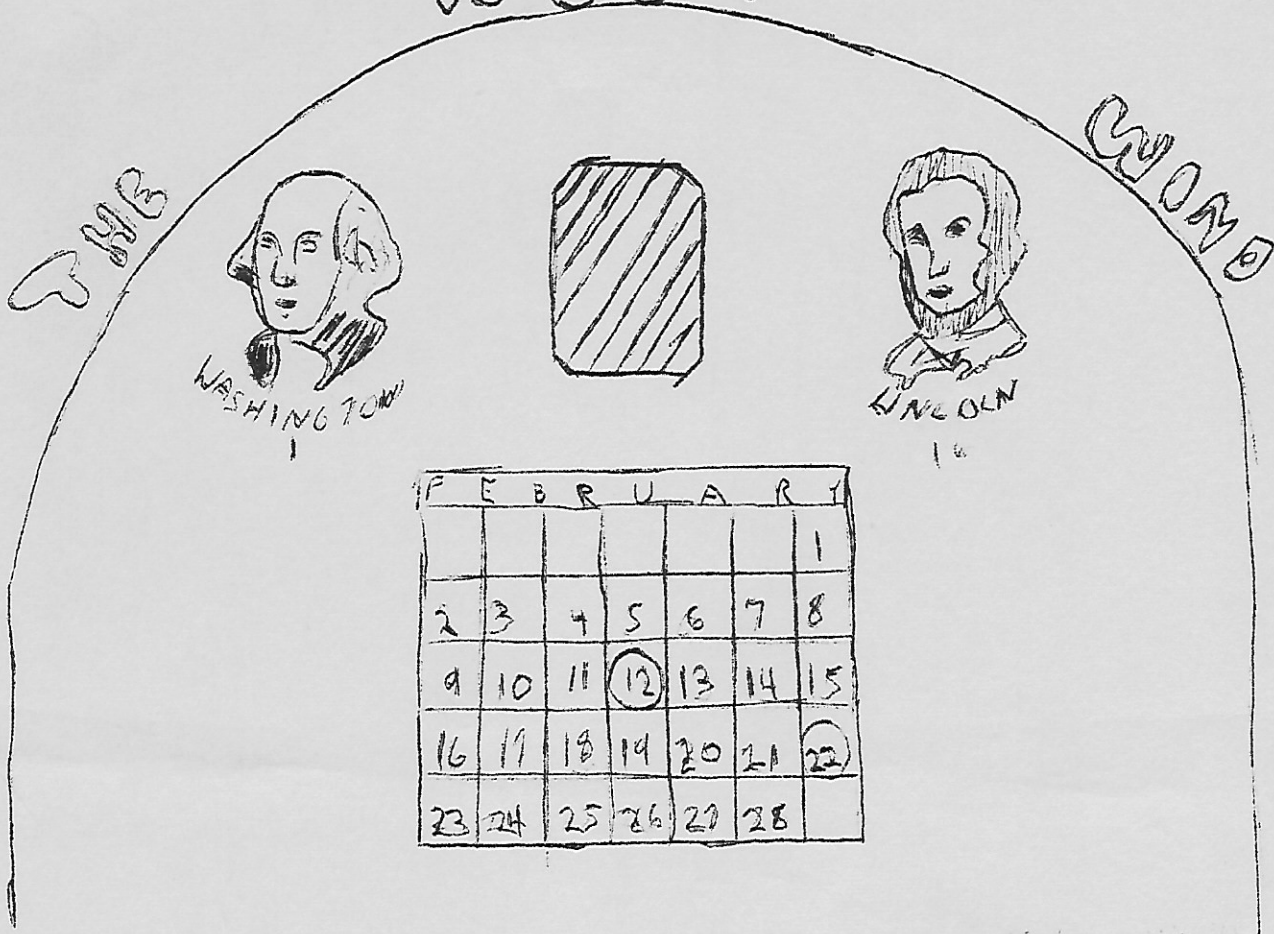

Our 38th President

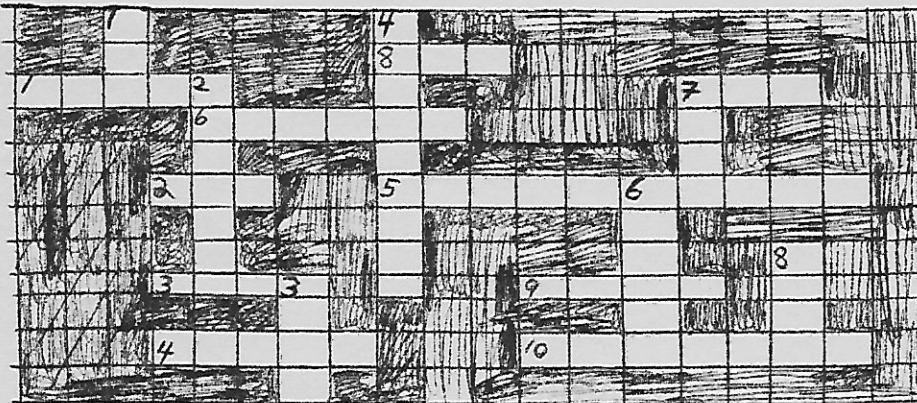
Richard M. Nixon is our 37th
