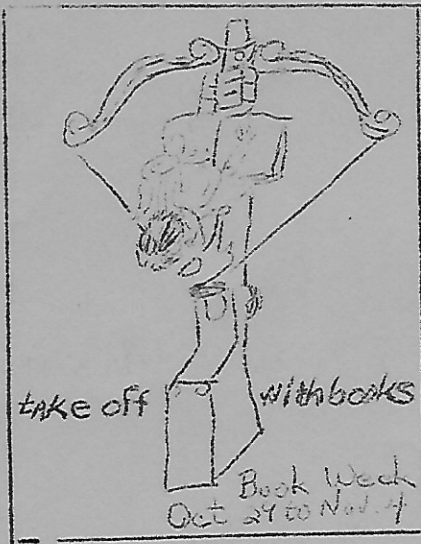

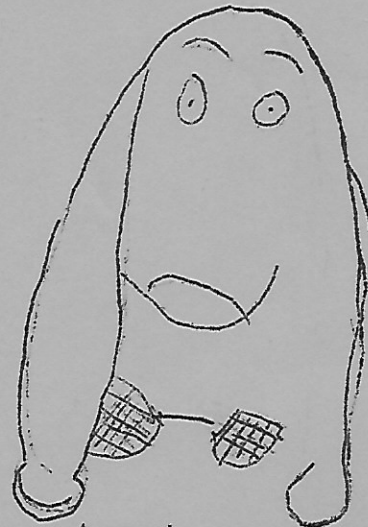

THE COW'S EYE

On October 6th, room 415 was invited into Mr. Barnum's class. Mr. Barnum dissected the eye of a cow.

He started by removing the skin tissue. He found this covering, a very tough substance, like a super ball.

After the covering was removed, we saw a little tube, called the optic nerve. The optic nerve sends messages to the brain.

We also saw the vitreous humor, which is a jelly-like substance that keeps the shape of the eye.

After he removed the vitreous humor, he removed the convex lens, which focuses the picture.

The picture is focused on the retina, which was contained in the tissue.

When everything was removed, we could see the pupil as just a hole covered with the cornea, a transparent covering.

We also saw the iris, which controls the size of the pupil.

We could not see the aqueous humor, which is a transparent fluid, because the fluid is too thin to be able to see.

6. magnifying glass

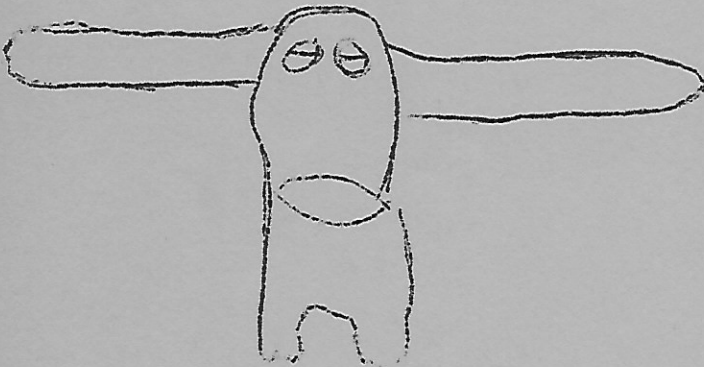
Procedure:

She went to school in Fredonia. Also she went to Royal Academy of Art and Conservatory of Music in Antwerp, Belgium.

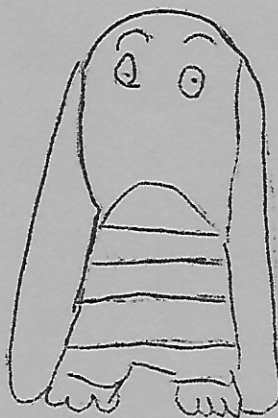
